This is a genuine plea for help and understanding.

The Parish Council has received several calls for help from farmers within the Parish and only today, **National Guidelines have been announced due a lack of respect for Government guidelines and landowners alike.** This is a critical time of the year for Farmers. Ewes with young lambs are now out in the fields; soon there will be cows and calves joining them. Your actions can severely jeopardise that livestock and the food on your table. Farmers in the UK are governed by strict health regulations to ensure the food produced in the U.K. that arrives on your table is Virus free and of top quality.

Not your problem? - Yes it is!

Please follow the Code.

Dogs must be on a lead at all times even on footpaths.

All dog faeces must be collected, bagged and binned,
(These are a high risk of infection in the food chain - YOUR food chain.)

The riding of horses, bicycles, motor bikes etc on footpaths is strictly forbidden - Footpaths mean on foot.

Remember apart from groups from the same family walkers must be in groups of no more than two. This includes cyclists and those on horseback using designated bridle paths.

Please remember that the land on which you are walking - including footpaths across fields is privately owned and is managed by these owners. If walkers do not respect and follow the code, these footpaths will be closed to protect walkers and landowners alike.

Please behave as if you were walking in your garden.
